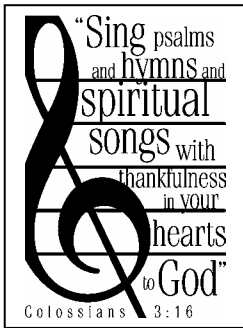

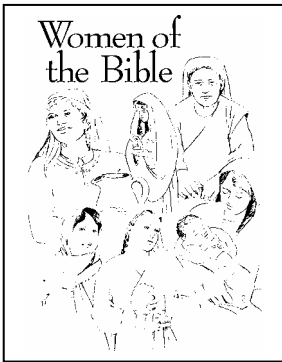

What is Per Capita?

Per Capita is a charge levied by the Presbytery for each active member of the congregation, and provides a means for Presbyterians to pay administrative and ecclesiastical expenses. It has been a part of our funding history for over 150 years.

The funds raised through per capita for the Presbytery pay for the administrative budget which includes:

- ⌘ Compensation for the Stated Clerk of Presbytery of the Cascades
- ⌘ Meeting expenses for Presbytery Council and committee meetings
- ⌘ Annual consultations for Candidates-under Care with the Committee on Preparation for Ministry (including travel expenses for seminary students required to attend these meetings)
- ⌘ Background checks on prospective ministers
- ⌘ Telephone, postage, office space rental, equipment & maintenance, office supplies and printing, the audit of the Presbytery finances, insurance, legal fees and the Presbytery directory
- ⌘ The per capita portion for Synod and General Assembly helps Commissioners from large and small churches to attend General Assembly

Per capita provides essential services. Our per capita this year is **\$21.26** per active member (\$5.79 for General Assembly, \$5.17 for Synod of the Pacific,

and \$10.30 for Presbytery of the Cascades), and is due by the end of January. Please consider writing a check to Chapel by the Sea for each church member in your household to cover this expense, and drop it in the offering plate.

Please mark the check to indicate it is to be used for per capita. Thank you!
